PATRON OF ISWI 2017 Kumi Naidoo

Kumi was born in Durban, South Africa, in 1965. His journey of social change began as a teenager in South Africa as he battled the repressive apartheid regime. Living in exile in England, he earned a doctorate in political sociology at Oxford University. After Nelson Mandela's release from prison, Kumi returned to South Africa and served as the spokesperson of the Independent Electoral Commission, as well as training the staff, during South Africa's first ever free elections in 1994. Since then, he has supported, inspired and organised various social and environmental initiatives and campaigns. His work is best described as a courageous effort to combat social injustice and environmental destruction.

Dinner

Warm dinner will be served every evening during the conference. The exact times vary due to the various cultural events and can checked on the schedule on pages 26-27.

Most of the time you will have your dinner at the Mensa. Please have a smile ready for the Mensa staff - they are working a lot of extra hours to cook for and serve you. **Please do not leave your dishes on the table.** There is a conveyor belt to put them on.

Groupleaders

Two or more local students will guide you through your group discussions and attempt to provide you with everything necessary for a fruitful discussion. They will also listen out for any problems that might occur, so please don't hesitate to ask them.

Getting Information

Public Transport

Ilmenau has 3 bus lines - A,B and C. Each trip costs $1,20 \in$ and can be paid to the bus driver. Buses go quite slowly and usually not on the most direct routes. Alternatively, you may take the train if you live on "Pörlitzer Höhe", which costs $1,50 \in$. For this reason, walking tends to be the most popular means of transport in Ilmenau.

What to do if you fall ill?

In any case, please let us know by contacting your Groupleaders or the Info Point! The Info Point has information on the physicians in Ilmenau. Moreover, someone from the Info Point can accompany you to the doctor for translation and explanation purposes. Your stay in Ilmenau is covered by our health insurance, but please note that our insurance is only valid in (acute) emergency cases and only for the minimal required amount of medical health care.

In case you have to consult a doctor and you do not have someone from the ISWI team with you, please show the German text on the right side (p. 49) to the doctor and show them the our contact information (Info Point: +49 3677/69-3333).
